Functionality meets aesthetics: office equipment for an ecological wooden house















A home office that can also disguise itself as a built-in closet, those were the requirements of the owners. There should be space for printers, scanners, computers and folders, but they should be able to disappear behind the doors in an emergency. Because the office equipment is integrated in the living room of the wooden house, the piece of furniture should not only fit visually, but also be extremely practical. In addition, Theo Janßen had to work with two different depths. Large devices disappear as a whole, but the side view remains inconspicuous. Open shelves offer space for decoration and books and loosen up. Due to the room-high construction, the office equipment looks as if it was made of one piece.

Designing with parts and sawing lists in TENADO HOLZ later saves Theo Janßen working time in the workshop


For the office equipment in the wooden house, the master carpenter worked primarily with levels in TENADO WOOD and marked them in colour.

In this way, even with complex constructions, it is clearly recognizable which component goes where and which individual parts belong together, He can hide individual levels with a click and thus look behind the fronts at any time.

The practical live evaluation regularly helps Theo Janßen when ordering, because all the types of wood used are listed on the parts lists. For example, the boreholes are precisely marked on the sawing list. In this way, the trainee also knows how to prepare cupboard walls for assembly,
